

THE OPPORTUNITY PASSPORT

The Opportunity Passport financial literacy training and savings match program, part of the Jim Casey Youth Opportunities Initiative, is available statewide in Nebraska. As a component of the Connected Youth Initiative, youth and young adults in Nebraska who have experienced foster care, homelessness, are pregnant or parenting, are exiting the juvenile justice system or are a victim of sex and labor trafficking and are between 14 and 26 years of age and disconnected from permanent family supports are eligible to participate.

The program and dedicated Opportunity Passport team equips participants with financial knowledge, support in connecting to banking and other community resources, and guidance in planning and making asset purchases that increase financial well-being.

Participants complete the KEYS to Your Financial Future curriculum, an 8-part training focused on a wide breadth of financial literacy topics:

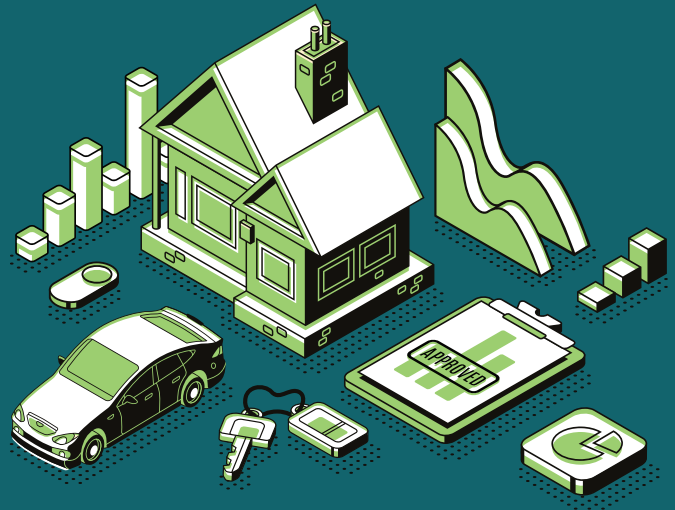

Opportunity Passport also offers Asset Specific training, such as vehicle purchasing and maintenance.

Participants must complete KEYS training, have a bank account, and save funds to make asset purchases. Assets increase overall stability, net worth, and access to opportunities. Participants save, with support along the way from OPP staff and training, and when ready, their savings are matched by program funds. Asset purchases include vehicles, housing, education, health, credit building, small business startup, child savings accounts/college savings accounts and other investments.

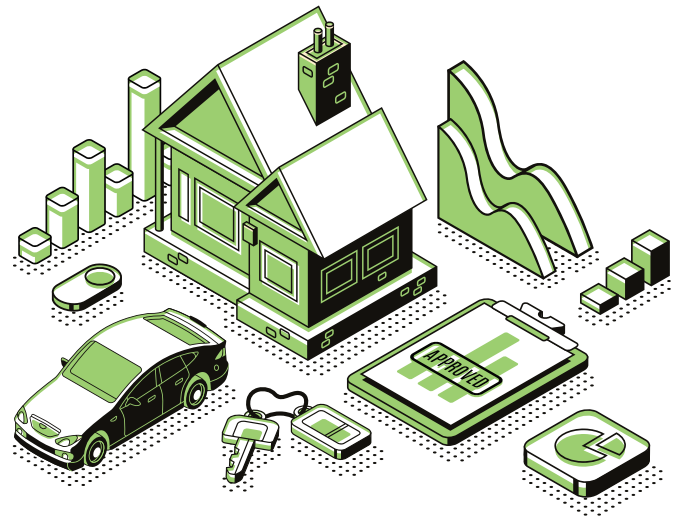
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
